Patti Henni once again offered a wonderful illustrated presentation about some of the women who were among the first computer programmers. They were instrumental in programming ENIAC (Electronic Numerical Integrator and Computer), one of the earliest electronic general-purpose computers. In 1946 the Army held a special ceremony to unveil the ENIAC and to honor the men who designed the hardware. The women, who did most of the programming and made it work, were not invited to the event and were never mentioned. It wasn't until almost 40 years later, in 1985, that their story was 'discovered' and their innovative work began to be recognized.

Randy Pierce, Inspirational Speaker

At the age of 22, Randy Pierce, who had graduated from UNH and started a career as a hardware design engineer unexpectedly lost his vision due to a devastating neurological disease. At the age of 39, the neurological disorder suddenly attacked in other ways, resulting in his being confined to a wheelchair and the next two years working to get out of that wheelchair and with his new Dog Guide Quinn at his side. In 2010, Randy set a goal to be the first blind hiker to summit all 48 of the New Hampshire 4,000-footers in 10 years. He accomplished all 48 peaks in just 37 months after he began his quest. Randy who now has a new guide dog, Autumn, has successfully completed the April 2015 and 2016 Boston Marathons. He has climbed the iconic Mount Kilimanjaro with a team of friends, reaching the summit on September 26, 2015. Randy's passion for new experiences continues to encourage him to turn adversity into growth and opportunity, inspiring others to reach their peak potential as Randy has and continues to do.
